- fosters a European sense of belonging.



OUR RESPONSE: THE CULTURE COMPASS

The Culture Compass for Europe establishes a vision based on the strengths of European culture: our shared values, our freedoms, our identity.

THE VISION: EUROPE FOR CULTURE, CULTURE FOR EUROPE



"Europe for Culture"

The Culture Compass is designed to be transversal, to support culture across strategies, sectors, policies, and funding tools by:

- safeguarding the fundamental freedom of artistic expression,
- ensuring everyone's right to create and participate in culture,
- empowering and protecting artists and cultural professionals,
- promoting the cultural sectors to thrive, innovate, and compete globally,
- addressing specific challenges of individual sectors.

"Culture for Europe"

The EU will leverage Europe's rich cultural diversity, cultural heritage and creativity to:

- boost people's well-being,
- strengthen democratic and societal resilience,
- help regions grow and bring communities together,
- drive economic progress and enhance Europe's competitiveness,
- strengthen Europe's **global** leadership.

The Culture Compass is supported by

four overarching tools:

- Draft Joint Declaration between the European Parliament, the Council and the Commission, on key principles for cultural policy in Europe,
- State of Culture report in the EU, including specific emphasis on artistic freedom,
- EU structured dialogue on Culture with stakeholders, as a platform for dialogue,
- **EU Cultural Data Hub,** to support evidence-based policy making.

Investment

To bring this vision to life, the Culture Compass will mobilise existing and forthcoming **funding instruments** at every level, in parallel with **private investment and philanthropy.** The Commission will:

- **simplify access to EU funding for culture** and update the CulturEU funding guide,
- develop EU quidelines on strategic investment in culture.

FLAGSHIP ACTIONS OF THE CULTURE COMPASS

The Compass will guide policies through **four key directions** towards:



Direction 1

A Union that **upholds and strengthens European** values and cultural rights.

- Propose a new European Prize for Performing Arts.
- Publish a Report to support Member States in increasing the participation of and support to persons with disabilities in culture.
- Improve young people's access to cultural heritage through cultural heritage passes, DiscoverEU Culture Routes, and the EU youth discount card under Erasmus+.

Direction 2

A Union that **empowers artists and cultural professionals and supports people.**

- Propose an **EU Artists Charter**.
- Establish a Youth Cultural Ambassadors network.
- Present EU guidelines on culture, health and well-being.

Direction 3

A Union that draws on culture and cultural heritage to become more **competitive**, **resilient and cohesive**.

- Present a dedicated AI strategy for cultural and creative sectors.
- Strengthen the European Heritage Label and the European Capitals of Culture post-2033.
- Adopt a Communication and a proposal for a Council Recommendation on the future of the New European Bauhaus (NEB).

Direction 4

A Union that champions international cultural relations and partnerships.

- Together with the HRVP, update the EU Strategy on international cultural relations and leverage the Team Europe approach for culture.
- A new phase of the EU4Culture Programme in the Eastern Neighbourhood.
- Launch a new Euro-Med initiative for culture, sport and tourism in the context of the Pact for the Mediterranean
